### **YOUNG PEOPLE:**

- 1. Join Deep's Action Research Team (@deepcenter912)
- Join/follow Georgia Youth Justice Coalition (@younggajustice)
- 3. Start a banned book reading group
- 4. Talk to your parents about who they'll vote for and how the candidates hold power over the decisions impacting your classrooms.

### **PARENTS:**

- 1. Ask/demand your child's school to include the courses listed on the opposite page
- 2. Ask/demand the SCCPSS school board do this, too
- Support our superintendent in respecting and preserving teachers' autonomy
- 4. Vote for candidates who support your student's interests

### **EDUCATORS:**

- Make your students your allies. Show them you're fighting for them (and they can fight for you, too.)
- Join Deep Writing Project and connect to like-minded educators for solidarity and advocacy
- 3. Use Learning For Justice curriculum (learningforjustice.org)
- 4. Strategically partner with like-minded individuals to develop messaging and meeting Common Core standards
- 5. Talk with administrators to align messaging.
- Partner with teachers who have a lot of credibility in the community, then get parents on board as credible messengers, too.
- 7. If you've been disciplined for teaching the truth, litigation and legal protection is available through Southern Poverty Law Center
